

Orange County Executive Neuhaus Presents First-Ever Cybersecurity Scholarship

Orange County Executive Steve Neuhaus announced that Orange County Government has awarded its first-ever Cybersecurity Scholarship to a Mount Saint Mary College (MSMC) cybersecurity student during the college's Annual Scholarship Appreciation Brunch, held at Osiris Country Club in Walden, NY.

The scholarship was awarded to MSMC student Josiah Maddicks and funded through proceeds from Orange County's Hudson Valley Regional Cybersecurity Summit, hosted at MSMC in March. The Summit brought together more than 360 attendees from 26 counties, along with experts from the FBI, U.S. Secret Service, New York State Homeland Security, the U.S. Military Academy, and major technology companies such as AWS, Google, and IBM. This investment supports the expansion of cybersecurity education and helps cultivate the next generation of cybersecurity professionals in the Hudson Valley.

During the Scholarship Appreciation Brunch, MSMC President Robert Gervasi introduced the scholarship recipients, including the inaugural Orange County Cybersecurity Scholarship. Orange County leadership joined MSMC officials, families, donors, and students to celebrate academic excellence and community partnership.

"As a proud MSMC alumnus, I'm honored that Orange County is supporting students pursuing careers in cybersecurity," said Orange County Executive Steve Neuhaus. "Investing in cybersecurity education strengthens the entire region, and we are proud to help students like Josiah prepare to protect our communities in an increasingly digital world."

"This scholarship highlights Orange County's commitment to developing local cybersecurity talent," added Glenn R. Marchi, Ph.D., Orange County Commissioner/Chief Information Officer. "Our partnership with MSMC helps equip students with the skills and encouragement needed to pursue careers that safeguard our region."

MSMC President Robert Gervasi praised the County's support, noting: "This award not only assists a deserving student, but it also reinforces the powerful role higher education and local government can play together in strengthening our digital future."

Orange County and MSMC plan to continue the scholarship partnership and expand cybersecurity education and workforce development initiatives across the Hudson Valley.



Orange County Executive Steve Neuhaus Honors Joshua Klotz of Sparrow Bush as Citizen of the Month

Orange County Executive Steven M. Neuhaus is proud to recognize Joshua Paul Klotz of Sparrow Bush as the County's Citizen of the Month for December, honoring his extraordinary spirit of service, compassion, and dedication to his community.

Joshua, a 2019 graduate of Port Jervis High School and a member of the 2025 graduating class of the Bridges Program at SUNY Orange, has devoted his life to lifting others up. Born with Down syndrome, Joshua has never allowed challenges to define or limit him. Instead, he has become a powerful example of perseverance, faith, and love in action, touching countless lives through his selfless service.

"Joshua represents the very best of Orange County; kindness, selflessness, and a commitment to serving others," said Neuhaus. "He has a heart for people and a joyful spirit that lights up every room he enters, and those who are in it. Joshua reminds each of us that you don't need a title or a spotlight to make a difference, just compassion and the willingness to help. I am proud to honor him as December's Citizen of the Month."

Joshua's volunteer work spans numerous organizations, churches, schools, and community efforts across the region, including:

- **St. Mary's Church (Port Jervis):** Serving breakfast, assisting with the Christmas Food Basket Program, volunteering at the food pantry, and helping with St. Joseph's Table
- **Middletown Lions Club:** Supporting the No Child Hungry backpack program at St. Paul's Methodist Church
- **SUNY Orange:** Volunteering at the bookstore and Sarah Wells Café
- **Special Olympics:** Competing proudly on the Thunder Bolt Track & Field Team
- **East Main Elementary School:** Assisting in his sister Shannon's art class
- **Port Jervis High School:** Volunteering for the All-Night Grad Party and serving as honorary waterboy for the varsity football team
- **United Presbyterian and Reformed Church (Port Jervis):** Helping with community dinners
- **The Boodle Box Project:** Supporting West Point Cadets
- **Personal Outreach:** Delivering flowers and cards to community members who are ill, recovering, or grieving

"I am so proud to see Josh has been named the Orange County Citizen of the Month," said Orange County Legislator Tom Faggione. "Spending time with him, you immediately feel his positive energy and sincerity. He reminds us that service and good deeds come from the heart, and our community is stronger because of him. He is a great person through and through, and I am very lucky to call Josh my friend."

Denise Hulse, who nominated him, said Joshua's character and compassion made this recognition an easy choice.

"Josh is a genuinely caring, faith-driven, and compassionate young man who brings warmth and positivity to everyone he meets," said Hulse. "He gives of himself every single day through acts of service, both big and small, and never expects anything in return. His life is a testament to love in action, and I can think of no one more deserving of this honor."

Joshua was formally presented with the Citizen of the Month Award by County Executive Neuhaus in front of his family and friends, who gathered to celebrate his remarkable achievements and unwavering commitment to service.

"Josh inspires us to be kinder," Neuhaus added. "He proves that leadership doesn't have to be loud, it can be about quietly lifting others up, being a good person, and helping your community."

The Orange County Executive's Citizen of the Month Program recognizes individuals who make positive contributions to their communities and inspire others through their actions and character. Joshua embodies these values in every way.







Dear Mayor Howley and Trustees:

As we close out our 2025 season, the Lakeside Farmers Market at Greenwood Lake comes to the Village with some exciting news, deep appreciation, and a request.

The 2025 market season saw continued growth and success with an average of 325 guests shopping from an average of 12 local vendors at 23 markets. The market has become a regular Saturday morning destination for shoppers, including Greenwood Lake residents and visitors with an increasing number of shoppers from the region including West Milford and Warwick.

Now we're on to our next chapter. We are excited to announce that the Board of Grow Local Greenwood Lake has agreed to make the Lakeside Farmers Market at Greenwood Lake part of their non-profit organization, relieving the Village of the responsibility of the market. The market will continue at Winstanley Park, running from the last Saturday in May until the last Saturday in October with the Thanksgiving Market on the Saturday before.

The success we've enjoyed over the last five years would not have been possible without the commitment and support of the Village of Greenwood Lake. Starting with the vision of Mayor Dwyer and continuing with the support of Mayor Howley, the Village has supported the market and facilitated its success. Special appreciation goes to Kathleen Holder and Holly Brown for financial administration of the market including the \$22,665 Resiliency Grant from New York Agriculture.

Another success is Market Bucks, a program that provides \$5 vouchers distributed through the Food Pantry, Senior Center, American Legion Post 1443, and Warwick VFW, introduced in 2023. Over \$17,000 in vouchers have been redeemed since then, feeding our community and supporting our vendors. A successful fundraising campaign in 2025 brought in \$3140 but we are \$650 short of funds to cover vouchers redeemed. Additionally, we are requesting Village support for our 2026 Market Bucks program with a \$1000 donation, making the total amount of our request \$1650.

Thanks for the opportunity to present this final report to the Village and for your support over the past 5 years. We look forward to continuing to support and enrich the community.
